



A MUSEUM DEDICATED TO THE ROMAN HISTORY OF NARBONNE

The Etablissement public de cooperation culturelle (EPCC) Narbo Via brings together three sites: the Horreum, a labyrinth of underground galleries in the heart of Narbonne, Amphoralis, which presents the remains of a town of Gallo-Roman potters and the new Narbo Via museum.

Since its inauguration on May 19th, the Narbo Via museum has become an essential place to understand Roman Antiquity, with more than 7,000 pieces, thus returning its noble letters to the capital of the Roman province of Narbonne, *Narbo Martius*.

Its monumental wall made up of 760 stone blocks, mostly from the Roman necropolises of the ancient city, surprises young and old alike. Spread over almost 28 986 ft², the exhibition area presents, with more than 580 artifact, the city of *Narbo Martius* during the Roman Empire: social organization, architecture (monumental remains and sumptuous decorations from the houses of the archaeological site of «Clos de la Lombarde», the most beautiful collection of Gallo-Roman paintings outside Italy); economic and port complex.

A strong architectural design

The building was realized by the international architecture firm «Foster + Partners», associated with the studio «Adrien Gardère» for its museography and with the operational architect Jean Capia. The architecture of the place combines simplicity and innovation. The facades of the building are made up of horizontal layers of laminated structural concrete, which is reminiscent of stratigraphy in archeology and, therefore, makes the museum a link between the past and the present. The clean and deeply modern structure of the building is also synonymous with modularity of space and offers optimal durability to the site, preserving it from heat and sun.

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A collaborative project for the diffusion of cultural knowledge

Narbo Via will showcase the latest advances in archaeological research, through partnerships with research laboratories and educational institutions: the CNRS (French National Centre for Scientific Research), the Inrap (French National Institute for Preventive Archaeological Research), the University of Montpellier (France), the University of Perpignan (France)... Narbo Via also aims to develop international partnerships with research laboratories in the future, notably from the two shores of the Mediterranean. These exchanges with the research community will allow Narbo Via to update its scientific spitch and transmit it to the public through its digital devices and its cultural mediation. Yesterday at the crossroads of Domitian and the Aquitaine routes, today just three hours away by car from Barcelona, Narbo Via is much more than a museum. Equipped with an auditorium of almost 200 places, research and educational workshops, a bookstore-shop, gardens with open-air shows and, soon, a restaurant, Narbo Via is a living space open to all visitors.

The new museum in numbers

Featured events

Festival «Radio France» - Wednesday, July 28th, from 3:30 p.m. to 6 p.m.

The Radio-France Occitanie Festival organizes the «Ballades au musée» program at the Narbo Via museum. The Ellipsos Quatuor (saxophones) and percussionist Sylvain Fabre dialogue with the museum and the audience during a musical afternoon where percussions meet the most beautiful musical pieces by Johann Sebastian Bach and Gospel standards. The museum in a different way

MOBILE MUSEUM - AT THE MUSEUM

Every Tuesday, uninterruptedly from 3 p.m. to 5:30 p.m.

Installed in the lapidary gallery of the Museum, the «Mobile Museum» allows you to discover the Roman city of Narbo Martius and its evolution. The 3D frieze «the factory of time» details the evolution of the city through the centuries. Models and house plans on the Clos de la Lombarde site invite you to discover the Pompeii domus organization. You can also try your luck with the coins or test your knowledge with the Narbo-quiz. Price: included in the entrance ticket.

BOTANICAL VISIT - AMPHORALIS

Every Friday at 10 a.m.

Discover an ancient garden and ancient cultivation techniques, echoing the natural cultivation practices of today. The Gallo-Roman garden of Amphoralis features the main plants listed by Latin archaeologists. They wear a hat in case of heat and sturdy shoes to explore the park.

GALLOROMAN DEMONSTRATION - AMPHORALIS

Tuesday July 27th, August 3rd and 24th, interruptedly from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m.

Observe during your visit a demonstration of the manufacture of ceramics on a rod wheel, just as it may have existed in ancient times. This tower, made entirely of wood, is known thanks to ancient representations on vases or paintings from Pompeii. Wear a hat in case of strong heat and good shoes. OIL LAMP WORKSHOP - AMPHORALIS

Every Wednesday at 3, 4 and 5 p.m.

Oil lamps are made and used throughout the Roman world for lighting. From simple to elaborate forms, they are also the support of a rich iconography: gladiator scenes, mythology, theatrical masks, etc. Get your hands dirty! Duration: approximately 30 minutes. 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Temporary exhibition: Veni, Vidi... Built!

From September 17th to December 31st, 2021, the Narbo Via museum presents its first temporary exhibition, «Veni, Vidi... Built!» The Narbo Via museum was designed to restore the memory of the great city to the current agglomeration ancient as it was: first Roman colony in Gallic land, capital city of the Province of Narbonnaise, an active trading port open to all Mediterranean world. Of this glorious past, no monument remains. It has been transmitted to us by written sources, excavations, and especially by a large amount of architectural elements used in re-employment in the city throughout its history.

The exhibition «Veni, Vidi... Built!» will offer a reflection on persistence of the prestigious architectural heritage of ancient Rome and will question the notion of «fragment», architectural and archaeological, as an element study and access to a broader cultural context. The way the contemporary architects continue to explore and adapt our heritage romain will be systematically treated over 5 400 ft², in 7 sequences themes: reuse, design, light, breathe, build, connect, inhabit. The exhibition will thus compare the main principles of architecture Roman (urban and social organization, light, circulation of air and water, structures and materials) with their reuse and reinterpretations contemporary to end in the Narbo Via museum building, crossroads between these two periods. 68 objects, from French institutions, Italian and English, will be presented (archaeological objects, drawings, plans, manuscripts, models, etc.).

The curator of this exhibition, Tom True, visiting scholar at the University of Kent and former deputy headmaster of the British School in Rome worked in close collaboration with the scientific team of Narbo Via and the firm Foster + Partners. The contributors solicited are specialists in ancient, Anglo-Saxon or French architecture. The Studio Adrien Gardère provided the scenography for the exhibition.

DISCOVERY TOUR OF THE EXHIBITION VENI, VIDI... BUILT!

Every Sunday at 11 a.m. from 19/09 - at the Museum

Visiting the exhibition allows you to understand the architectural techniques of the Romans, their ingenuity, their skills with the space and the materials, but also how contemporary architects continue to draw inspiration from them today. Drawings, watercolors, photos, models invite you to explore the know-how of Roman builders through the use of the light, mastery of ventilation and heating systems, the art of reusing materials and buildings, but also their talent as urban planners, from whom Norman Foster, the architect of Narbo Via, was inspired for many of his creations around the world... THEMATIC VISIT: ROMAN ARCHI, CONTEMPORY ARCHI!

Punctuated by the discovery of the monuments of Narbonne in Roman times and their architectural details, the visit invites you to explore in detail the Museum building, a remarkable new building in the modern city which in many ways recalls the past splendor of the ancient city. CLAY WORKSHOP

In the heart of the potters' village, in the park of the Amphoralis site, the workshop offers to discover how Gallo-Roman artisans were able to build their homes with the material they found on site in quantity: clay. Accompanied by Tanguy Wibaut («Terre en Ere» association), archaeologist specializing in raw clay construction, you work hands-on to prepare clay.
